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12 Additional Steps To Reopen California Safely

Reliable Data:

Begin weekly random tests to understand increase/decrease in infection rate, including questionnaire to identify possible source of spread.

Compile state and county track and trace data to help determine place of spread and vulnerable populations. Implement actions to control source of infection.

Test every resident and staff at nursing homes on a regular basis.

Begin a pilot program to test the effectiveness of a voluntary, Bluetooth-based contact notification app

Implement a quality control program to assess the reliability of current diagnostic tests.

State Mandates and Oversight:

Re-establish a strict shelter-in-place order for elderly and vulnerable residents, with limited exceptions for health and welfare.

Require masks in all publicly accessible, indoor spaces in communities with active COVID cases.

Institute protocols to monitor, educate and enforce compliance with physical distancing rules.

Supportive Programs:

Provide food, medicine and personal care to vulnerable people who must remain socially isolated.

Provide alternative housing to those who test positive and are not able to isolate from family members or roommates due to crowded living conditions.

Provide PPE to in-home care workers to protect them and their clients.

Public Disclosure:

Create a dashboard that reveals real time county data on tests, infections, hospitalization, ICU usage, PPE supplies, track and trace staffing, track and trace contacts per infected person.
