Economy


California's economy is growing faster than the national average but the state's unemployment rate remains the highest in the nation.




Crime

An estimated 160,000 Californians are homeless. That is less than one half of 1 percent of the population -- but more than any other state.



California spends about \$21,000 per student in local, state and federal funds on education for kindergarten through 12th grade students.



At the California State University system, tuition is about \$7,000 per year and total costs are about \$21,000.



California has set a goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions to 40 percent below its 1990 levels by 2030.


